# 2. Information Privacy

As students transition into university life, they often become more independent—not just in managing their time, but also in handling their personal and academic information.

At UBCO, <u>student privacy</u> is protected under British Columbia's Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act (FIPPA). This means details about a student's academic

performance, health, conduct, or housing are confidential and cannot be shared with others without their consent.

If the student in your life wants to grant you access to specific information, they must complete a third-party authorization form.

### 3. Winter Break Closure

The university is closed between Terms 1 and 2, and students living in residence are required to vacate their rooms during this time. While belongings may remain in residence rooms and suites, key cards are deactivated and will not work during the break. Details of the mandatory closure are in your student's <u>Residence Contract</u>.

This year, Student Housing be closed from 12 pm on December 20, 2025, until 12 pm on January 4, 2026.

Eligible students who require accommodation for **any duration** of the winter break due to extenuating circumstances must fill out a <u>Winter Break Residence Staythrough</u>

<u>Request</u> by Dec. 1, 2025.
